All children will be monitored closely by staff and if they become unwell with a temperature or a cough will be sent home. Confidentiality of staff and children are followed at all times – this includes withholding the names of staff, volunteers and pupils with either confirmed or suspected cases of coronavirus. 				
Poor hygiene practice	H	 Posters are displayed throughout the nursery reminding children to wash their hands, e.g. before entering nursery. Children wash their hands with soap before and after snack times and lunchtimes for no less than 20 seconds. Additional alcohol-based sanitiser (that contains no less than 60 percent alcohol) is provided for use where social distancing cannot be adhered to. Staff will wash hands before all food prep or food handling. Staff will practice correct hygiene when changing nappies by wearing gloves or thoroughly washing hands after they have changed a child's nappy. Infection control procedures are adhered to as much as possible in accordance with the DfE and PHE's guidance. Sufficient amounts of soap (or hand sanitiser where applicable), clean water, paper towels and waste disposal bins are supplied in all toilets and kitchen areas. Children are supervised by staff when washing their hands to ensure it is done correctly, where necessary. Children do not share cutlery, cups or food. III health H	 Staff are informed of the symptoms of possible coronavirus infection, e.g. a cough, difficulty in breathing and high temperature, and are kept up-to-date with national guidance about the signs, symptoms and transmission of coronavirus. Any child who displays signs of being unwell is immediately sent home. Any unwell children are moved to an empty room whilst they wait for their parent to collect them. Children displaying symptoms of coronavirus do not come in to contact with other children and as few staff as possible, whilst still ensuring the child is safe. The relevant member of staff calls for emergency assistance immediately if the child's symptoms worsen. The parents of an unwell child are informed as soon as possible of the situation by a relevant member of staff. Unwell children who are waiting to go home are kept in an area where they can be at least two metres away from others. Areas used by unwell children who need to go home are thoroughly cleaned once vacated. If unwell children are waiting to go home, they are instructed to use different toilets to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection. Spread of infection	Н	 Spillages of bodily fluids, e.g. respiratory and nasal discharges, are cleaned up immediately in line with the Infection Control Policy, using PPE at all times. Children (that are able to understand) are instructed to cough or sneeze into their elbow and use a tissue to cover their mouths where possible, disposing of the tissue in waste disposal units. Children (with staff help) clean their hands after they have coughed or sneezed. Parents are informed not to bring their children to nursery or on the nursery premises if they show signs of being unwell and believe they have been exposed to coronavirus. Children who have displayed symptoms of coronavirus must self-isolate for 14 days before returning to nursery.
